

Community Health Worker (CHW) Training Program Announcement

Center for the Study of Social Determinants of Health, Institute on Health Disparities, Equity and the Exposome, Meharry Medical College, in collaboration with Baptist Health Sciences University (BHSU), the Tennessee Charitable Care Network (TCCN), and the Rural Health Association of Tennessee (RHAT).

Greetings! We are currently recruiting persons who want to participate in the CHW Training Program at Meharry Medical College. The CHW training consists of **three tracks: CHW I, CHW II, and CHW III.**

- **Track 1** is designed for persons without any formal education or work experience in the health care field. It will take approximately 161 hours to complete. Track I provides a stipend during training.
- Track II is for persons who have a minimum of one year of work experience or education in a health profession and is referred to as the Health Service Provider (HSP) track. It will take approximately 201 hours to complete. Track II provides a stipend during training.
- Track III is an Apprenticeship program. It will take 12 months/2000 hours to complete. Track III requires full time employment and supervisor consent to participate.
